How much time, how many people are needed?

Has been broken down into 5 parts:

- Advertising (Dan = currently have 30 advertisers +/-)
- Needed: Managing editor, layout editor, someone to help with distribution
- Go out quarterly, articles from Dane County and Madison agencies, elected officials, regular articles. Articles about events, about ash tree fundraising, gardening tips etc.
 - Feb 1 ,May 1, Aug 1, Nov 1
 - Edit for length, grammar etc. doing layout
 - Dan pays for Microsoft 365 license, reimburse managing editor (~\$110 for 5 licenses)

- Distribution: sent to one location, then divide into 5-6 people distribute to block captains, block captains take door to door.
- Hi Neighbor has been fully funded through the ads (break even).
- Oona = managing editor of Northside newspaper through her work!
 - Timing—main thing is to have articles not go out of date.
- Next step: set up transition meeting with Amil and others who are interested
 - Copy of latest electronic version of all the ads and contact info for people interested in writing regular articles (elected people etc)
 - Contact info for block captains from Kathy
 - Distribute electronically only until COVID is over (on ramp time, start with lay out and design and then transition back to doing in print)
 - Maybe print a few for putting at library, grocery store, local business etc.
 - Small printer like Kinkos or Fed Ex, small press run version (smaller)
 - Drive presence to social media from print
 - Kris has managing editor role at another publication but is happy to help with volunteer recruitment

Winter Treat Delivery

- Kathy is nominated to lead on collecting a list

Madison Metro Hearing on Route 38 + other local routes

On Wednesday, December 9 at 6:00 pm, Metro Transit and the City of Madison Transportation Commission will hold a virtual public hearing to review and discuss service adjustments proposed for March, 2021.

Proposed changes

• **Route 2** – Increase weekday frequency from every 30 minutes to every 15 minutes in both directions between 6 am and 6 pm. (To offset suspension of Route 10.)

- **Route 6/26** Schedule adjustment so that transfer can be made at East Towne from Route 26 to Route 6 on final weekday trip of the day.
- Route 10 Route suspended. (Service added to Routes 2 and 38.)
- Route 27 Route suspended. (Service added on Route 2.)
- Route 38 Weekday route restored with added mid-day service. During morning and afternoon peaks, buses run every 30 minutes in both directions between the UW Hospital and Pflaum Rd. (via Wilson/Square & Dennett/Dempsey). During mid-day, buses continue to run every 30 minutes in both directions between the UW Hospital and Isthmus area (via Wilson/Square). (To offset suspension of Route 10.)
- Route 81 Route adjusted. Bus stop shifted from N. Franklin to N. Blair
- **Bus stop change** Due to safety reasons, stop removed on Whitney Way at Schroeder (ID #8418). Affects routes 18, 50 and 51.

Plan Commission upcoming items

 On September 15, 2020, an ordinance of the Common Council sponsored by Alder Grant Foster, District 15, was introduced to redone 3614-3700 Milwaukee Street and 102-122 West Corporate Drive from CN(Conservancy District), TR-C1 (Traditional Residential-consistent 1 District), and IL(Industrial-limited District-Urban 1 District) TSS (Traditional Shopping Street District) and TAr-U 1 (Traditional Residential-Urban 1 District) consistent with recommendations in the Milwaukee Street Special Area Plan. The applications will be reviewed by: Plan Commission on November 9, 2020, 5:30 p.m. and by the Common Council on November 17, 2020, 6:45 p.m.

2) On September 15, 2020, a Resolution of the Common Council was introduced, Amending the City of Madison Official Map to establish mapped reservations for future Streets and Highways in the current and future City of Madison generally located north of Milwaukee Street between North Fair Oaks Avenue and West Corporate Drive consistent with recommendations in the adopted Milwaukee Street Special Area Plan. The proposed Resolution will be reviewed by: The Plan Commission on November 9, 2020, 5:30 p.m. and the Common Council on November 17, 2020, 6:45p.m.
