Updates on Hi Neighbor (Dan)

Many businesses on hold because of current business conditions. Revolution Cycles will be coming on board. Holding off on publication until late February / early March because of some articles.

Dan is working on postal permit.

City of Madison Neighborhood Grants Program ideas (7:10PM) (Fred)

Grant money can be used for leadership skill building (running a neighborhood board). There are incentives for COVID related projects. Need to talk with Linda Horvath (City planning division) before February 22nd, to submit application by middle March

-Potential grant ideas: native plant areas, picnic tables, native prairies (beautification), murals, pop-up markets, rain gardens, oak trees

- Grant Foster: Lansing Edible Food Forest folks might have a shovel-ready idea (benches); they may be able to apply on their own, but may be stronger with neighborhood association support

Alder Grant Foster

- Upcoming Transportation meeting (Wednesday) will discuss proposal to reinstate route 38, links to provide public comment (in-meeting or written) are in Grant's blog
 - o Much bigger transportation redesign coming in 2022
- Milwaukee rezoning did not pass, a separate rezoning is being pursued
- Starkweather drive to be reconstructed with shared-use pass along the creek side, new bridge to connect to Garver property
- Primary election next week
- Spring election first Tuesday in April

County Supervisor Kristen Audet

- New Emergency Order goes into effect on Wednesday. A few highlights:
 - A Gathering inside where food or drink is offered or provided is limited to 25 individuals. A
 Gathering inside where food or drink is not offered or provided is limited to 50 individuals.
 Individuals must maintain six feet physical distancing and face coverings are required.
 - A Gathering outside where food or drink is offered or provided is limited to 100 individuals. A Gathering outside where food or drink is not offered or provided is limited to 150 individuals. Individuals must maintain six feet physical distancing. Face coverings required at gatherings of more than 50 individuals.
 - The requirements for types of face coverings was updated to be reflective of CDC guidance (e.g., cloth face coverings with two or more layers). Certain things are not allowed, such as, bandanas, single layer neck gaiters and ski masks.
 - Removal of provision to limit regulated childcare and four-year old kindergarten groups to 15. Indoor youth settings must follow gathering limits.
 - Regardless of any state-level changes to the mask mandate, Dane Co still has a mask mandate so that must be followed. Note that even in the new order where larger gatherings are allowed, masks and social distancing is still required.
 - There are a lot of new stories about the vaccine, side effects, distribution, and new variants being discovered. As a reminder, your best source for accurate and up to date information is Wisconsin Department of Health Services and Public Health Madison & Dane County. Both of these agencies have extensive updates on their websites and on their social media.
 - The PARC & Ride grant program is back and the County is now accepting grant applications. This grant program provides matching grants to communities or organizations interested in developing new regional bicycle playgrounds or regional bicycle/pedestrian trails. The 2021 Dane County Budget has \$500,000 in matching funds available through the PARC & Ride grant program. Grant applications to the PARC & Ride program are due Tuesday, June 1st, 2021. The grant guidelines and application forms are also available online at: www.danecountyparks.com/Information/Grants.
 - The city of Madison and Dane County have partnered on identifying a new permanent Men's Shelter. The new facility at 2002 Zeier Road will provide a home for shelter services that have been operating out of temporary facilities since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic and, before that, operated out of cramped quarters in downtown churches for the past 35 years.
