Treasurer's Report

- $\$ 3600$ short for ash trees. GoFund-Me option will end in late September
- I contacted Tree Health Management and obtained the guaranteed quote of what the cost to treat the 33 trees will be this year (note: the cost includes a 10\% discount).
- I eliminated the option of using GoFundMe because:

O As of September 30, 2021, GoFundMe is discontinuing the GoFundMe -- Charity, which would require that we re-register the campaign and would result in a new URL for the campaign; and

- Only 4 persons plus myself have used this option since March.

Perhaps we should highlight the information about the funds needed to treat the ash trees beyond just using bold font (e.g., a separate article, larger font size):

In 2015 and 2018, ECA raised sufficient funds to treat and save some of Eastmorland's most beautiful park ash trees from being cut down due to emerald ash borer (EAB). Together we saved 33 of the healthiest, largest ash trees in our neighborhood parks. These trees must be treated every three years according to current city policy. We must have all the funds to treat them again by fall 2021. The cost of the treatment will be $\$ 6,670.24$. As of $07 / 22 / 21$, we have raised $\$ 3,019.25$ to treat these 33 trees again, which leaves us $\$ 3,650.00$ short. Please donate any amount as every dollar adds up to help save a beautiful shade tree.

After I sent the July $22^{\text {nd }}$ email, I was contacted by Zach Eckberg of the Madison Parks Department regarding the treatment of the ash trees. I gave him the above information and indicated that ECA intended to contact LENA and SASY associations to see if they would contribute funds to treat the ash trees given that 22 of the previously treated ash trees are in Olbrich Park. He said that he intended to survey the trees in our parks to determine if all 32 trees still were appropriate for/needed treatment (note: I did not previously notice in Tree Health Management's proposal that the one tree we had treated in Ontario park had been cut down as its main trunk was split). I spoke with him again on August $9^{\text {th }}$; he looked at the trees in Eastmorland and O.B. Sherry parks and they all are appropriate for and in need of treatment. He expects that once he completes his survey this also will be true of all the trees in Olbrich park. He will send me a map of the trees that need to be treated.

PayPal changed their processing fees beginning August $2^{\text {nd }}$. The fee was $2.90 \%+\$ 0.30$ per transaction and now are $2.59 \%+\$ 0.49$ for online credit and debit card payments without Chargeback Protection or $2.99 \%+\$ 0.49$ for online credit and debit payments with Chargeback protection. Only IRS approved § 501 (c) (3) charitable organizations qualify for PayPal's discounted rate.
