Update on Walter Street Speeding from City Staff (recent message to Emily in response to request for a speaker)

Thanks for bringing this up. We are still working on the new program and rankings, so I think it's a bit early to discuss any plans for Walter Street. Once the program is finalized, we will have an initial ranking of projects. We do already have traffic data for Walter Street, so Walter will be ranked in the program.

We typically do not meet with residents to discuss potential projects until we have a ranking. Once a street ranks high enough, we can then begin the discussions on potential projects. We have a couple reasons for using this process. With the high number of requests we receive, and limited resources, we need to use our staff time as conservatively as possible. Another reason for waiting to meet, is that meeting with residents prior to a ranking can imply that the street in question is on track to get a project. This goes against the equitable aspect of the program or "squeaky wheel" issue where the most informed or organized areas of the city receive a disproportionate number of projects.

<u>Attached is the Traffic Calming Subcommittee's final report.</u> This has the latest information on the process that will be used for selecting projects.

Let me know if you have any questions, and if Walter Street ranks high enough, I look forward to attending a future ECA meeting.

Notes from ECA meeting:

- Could ECA help sponsor yard signs reminding cars of speed limit, until the street receives a ranking from the city?
- One possible solution from the city is wider traffic circles.
- Speeding is also an issue in blocks surrounding Schenk during school start and end times

Updates from Kristen Audet, County Supervisor

-Last night the county board passed the 2022 budget. The budget resolution I co-sponsored to provide \$500,000 for a conservation easement as part of the Voit Farm "Save the Farm" initiative was included in the final budget.

-We also recently passed two resolutions addressing PFAS contamination, one supporting the State Clear Act and another requesting a legal opinion from Dane County Corporation Counsel as to any and all ways the County can regulate airport activities, construction, and the work to clean up PFAS discharges through its storm water ordinances and other county authority. The resolution also indicates that Dane County will work with Public Health Madison and Dane County to create a central website to contain information related to PFAS, including tests and results and any agendas and minutes of public meetings where PFAS are being discussed. -Public Health Madison & Dane County has appointments for pediatric COVID vaccinations (ages 5-11); also information on boosters; individuals should visit the website for more information: https://publichealthmdc.com/coronavirus/covid-19-vaccine

- I haven't received the invoices from Thysse for the printing and mailing of the newsletters. I estimate these costs at \$1,540.16.
