Median Magic in Lake Edge

You might have noticed some of the medians on Lake Edge Boulevard looking a little more festive recently! The Lake Edge Neighborhood Association (LENA) secured a small City of Madison grant, and in fall 2024, neighbors in Lake Edge installed native plantings at each end of one of the Lake Edge Boulevard medians.

First, the group worked with Good Oak Ecological Services to kill off the turfgrass and mulch the planting site with shredded bark. Kat Prince, a Lake Edge resident and pollinator biologist, helped guide the selection and placement of plants in accordance with City guidelines. In October 2024, LENA threw a planting party (with snacks, of course), where neighbors planted 224 native flowers and bunch grasses right into the mulch. A neighborhood

volunteer took up the watering.

If you're inspired to make median magic yourself, check out the City of Madison's Adopt-a-Median program (and their great list of recommended

plants -- natives, because they're tough, and nothing over two feet because, well, drivers gotta see!).

In the Lake Edge median plantings' first full season in 2025, many of the plants were already sporting flowers. You'll see the dead vegetation left standing over winter to provide overwintering habitat for the insects using the plantings. Walk or drive by and take a look this spring and summer to see the plantings in their second full season!

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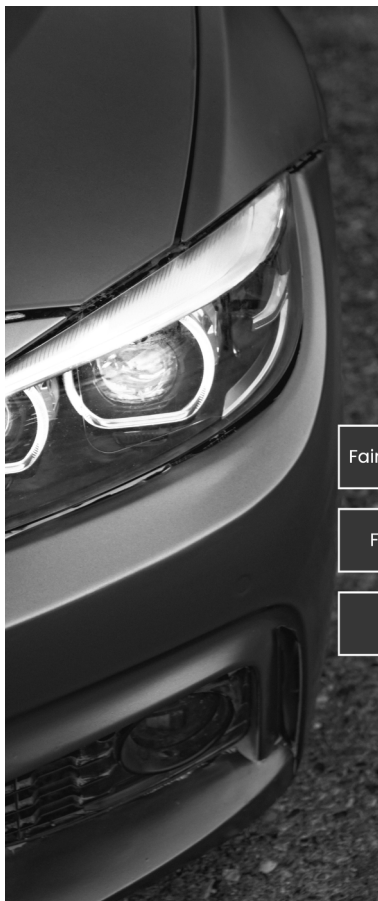
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The Prairie Behind the Parking Lot

Most people who shop at Woodman's on Milwaukee St. pay no attention to the prairie and wetland next to the parking lot. However, that often-ignored green space, connected to Eastmorland Park, plays an important role in the City of Madison's water system. Managed by the City's Engineering Division, it functions as a wetland and prairie that improves water and air quality and helps prevent neighborhood flooding.

The Engineering Division manages more than 1,500 acres of stormwater land across the city and contracts with Operation Fresh Start (OFS) to help maintain and restore these sites. For many years, OFS participants in their Legacy and Conservation Academy programs have worked throughout Eastmorland to help manage the Starkweather watershed. You might see their crews at any time of year in bright orange or yellow uniforms tramping through the wetlands and prairies along Starkweather Creek removing invasive species, planting oaks and other native plants, collecting seeds of native plants, or cleaning up along the creek.

"Over the six years I worked on this site, I've seen significant change," said Taylor Houghton, OFS Legacy program supervisor. "When I started it was overgrown with [invasive] burdock, and now it has a diversity of native plants that have become a source of native plant seeds that

are used to restore prairies around the city."

Additionally, prairie seeds collected by OFS participants go into the free seed packets you find at Pinney Branch and other Madison public libraries every spring as part of their Free Seed Library Program.

Members of Houghton's Legacy crew are doing this work as part of their curriculum to complete high school. It is difficult work, done in the cold of winter and heat of summer, but they know it is important to the community. It gives them a sense of pride and has taught them to see and understand the importance of green spaces they used to ignore. Every day on a work site is a biology lesson and it is also a lesson in perseverance. It takes grit to get up in the dark on winter mornings, to work outside in below-zero temperatures, and then go to classes at school.

In the coming years, OFS will be working to plant thousands of trees with the City of Madison's Forestry section, many of which will be planted in the Eastmorland neighborhood.

So, the next time you see an OFS crew out on the job, say 'hi' and take a moment to appreciate the hard work it takes to restore and maintain our city's too-often ignored green spaces.

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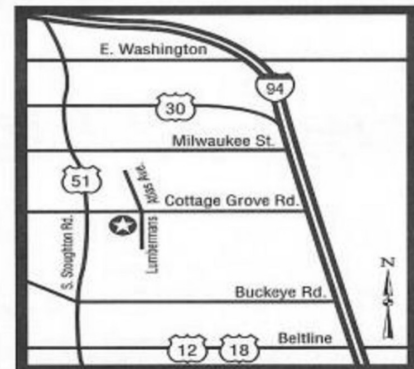

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MGE Electric Upgrade Project Update

Madison Gas and Electric (MGE) is planning to upgrade the electric system in the Eastmorland Neighborhood and surrounding areas to enhance service reliability, reduce outages, minimize tree trimming, and prepare the area for the next generation of power delivery.

This project is part of MGE's multi-year effort to modernize its electric distribution grid to meet the changing needs of our communities while making our systems less susceptible to weather and other threats. The work will include replacing aging facilities, installing new underground electric lines throughout the neighborhood, and replacing or removing existing overhead power lines.

What's New

The project is currently in the design phase, and construction activities are expected to start in mid-to-late 2027. MGE sent emails and postcards to Eastmorland residents in Nov. to notify

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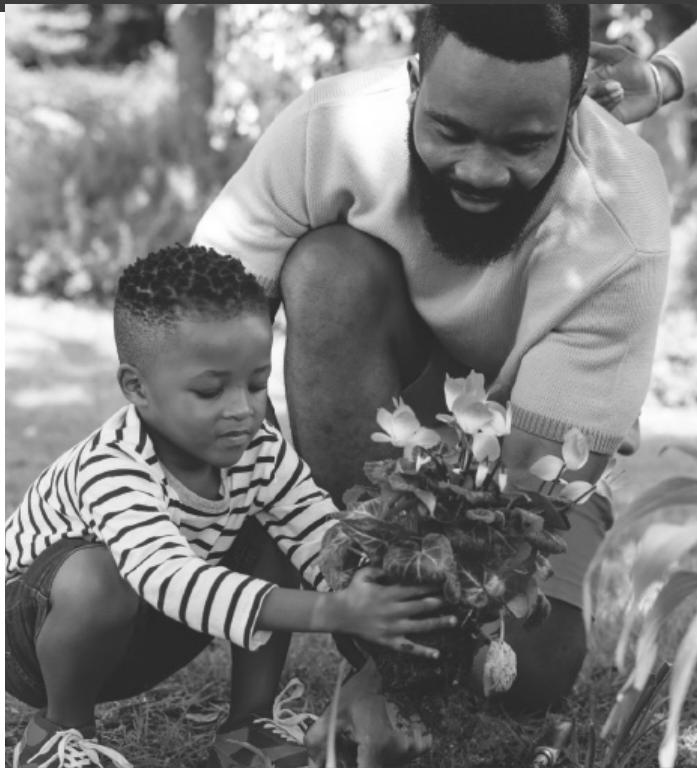
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Spotlight on Community: Why I volunteer with *Hi, Neighbor!*

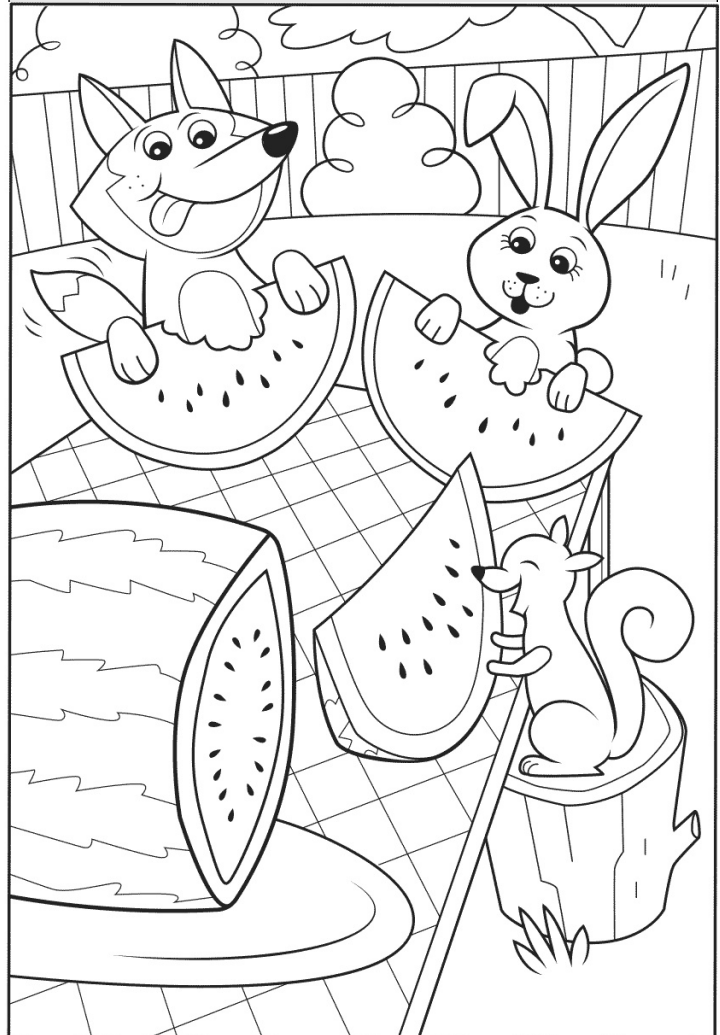

Building Progress on the Triangle

Exciting progress continues with the construction at the Eastmorland Community Center triangle! Now both buildings, the community center and the multi-family apartment homes are up on the property!

Apartments are getting ready for pre-leasing, with an anticipated move in date of October 1, 2026. Recently a "Name the Apartments" contest was held on social media and over 60 name suggestions from the community were received! It was great to hear so many creative and thoughtful ideas about these new homes built in the center of Eastmorland's neighborhood. The apartments will officially be called "Grace Commons at Eastmorland"!

This name indicates the goal of creating "common space for the common good" as well as indicating the courteous goodwill, or grace, in which this common space is intended.

The community center – shown in progress with the photo included – will be part of this collaborative, common space on the triangle. The hope is that both the community center and the apartment homes will be open this October!

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Hi everyone! Summer's right around the corner and community investment continues across District 15, including exciting progress on the future Eastmorland Community Center. Renovation and redevelopment work is actively underway on the apartment building and community center, with organizers continuing to build momentum around the space as a future hub for neighborhood gatherings, arts, education, and community programming. Community leaders are anticipating hard hat tours later this year as construction progresses.

The Starkweather redevelopment near Milwaukee Street is in full swing. The project plans to bring more

than 1,000 new housing units to the area while also incorporating green space, improved bike and pedestrian connections, public gathering areas, and long-term mixed-use neighborhood development along Starkweather Creek.

We've added more than 30,000 residents over the past decade, and current city projections estimate the population could grow to more than 309,000 by 2030, according to *The Cap Times*. Projects like Starkweather will be a game changer for Madison by helping bring both affordable and market-rate housing to the east side at a time when housing demand continues to grow across the city.

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Invasive Plant Awareness: Knotweed Species

If it's growing like a weed...maybe it is a weed! And if it's knotweed, then you will not want to underestimate this plant. Japanese knotweed (*Reynoutria japonica*), Bohemian knotweed (*Fallopia x bohemica*) and other knotweed species (*Reynoutria* spp.) are highly invasive, ecologically disruptive plants. Knotweed forms dense stands, displaces native species, exacerbates erosion along waterways, and can even damage infrastructure.

I've seen knotweed grow up through the cement slab of a garage floor using only the pale light from a small window and its enormous root system. The plant's reputation for damaging building foundations, sidewalks, sewer pipes and the like have made it particularly feared in urban areas. Listed as a noxious weed in the City of Madison, and also regulated by the state under WI Admin Code NR 40, you must control this plant if growing on your property. To identify, look for broad, spade-shaped leaves, and tough, segmented bamboo-like stems that can range in color from red to pale green with a white waxy overlay. Knotweed produces small, lacy cream-colored flowers along the tall, arching stems in late summer or early fall. More noticeable is the rapid growth habit. If you're wondering what plant obscured the view of your back fence in under a month, it could be knotweed. UW Extension and WI DNR are good places to start for more information on identification and control. You may report observations of the plant to the City of Madison via the "Report a Problem" section of the website: cityofmadison.com/reportaproblem

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This spring, we welcomed several new County Board Supervisors, and I was re-elected for my fourth term. I am looking forward to working with my new and returning colleagues to address the county's challenges over the next

two years. The county continues to face a structural operating deficit, though that has been reduced by about half after compromises were made in the 2026 budget. Operating funds are used for salaries, health insurance benefits, and more. The capital budget, which funds property purchase and facility costs, is separate from the operating budget, and we are not able to use any savings or proceeds in the capital fund for operating expenses.

The 2027 budget process is already under way. Typically, the County Executive issues budget directives to county departments at the end of May. In September, department heads will present their budget requests to the

County Board and the public. These public hearings will be held at 5:30pm on September 9, 15, and 16. After these hearings are held, standing County Board committees hold meetings about their respective departments' requests. On October 19 at 7pm, the County Board will hold a hearing on the County Executive's budget proposal, and on November 2, the County Board will hold a final hearing at 6pm about the budget as recommended by the Personnel & Finance Committee. 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My Neighbor's Garden: Natalie Stowe

Although Natalie Stowe has only inhabited her garden on Clover Lane a little over three years, she grows with the wisdom and patience of a seasoned gardener. In our twilight interview on her patio, Natalie recalls helping her green-thumbed mother tend flowers as a child, and growing her own first little patch - marigolds, peppers, tomatoes - at 10 years old. Later, living in apartments, she gardened in pots. When she and her husband Jeremy began looking for houses, the fenced garden on Clover Lane - large for our neighborhood, with clearly established if somewhat faded borders - drew her in.

Natalie loves flowers and vegetables in equal measures. On our garden tour, she shows me emerging herbs, year-old blueberries for which she maintains acidic soil, and the biggest bleeding hearts I've ever seen in my life.

"I try to learn something new every year, and do something good for the earth," she says. "Beautiful gardens take time!" One year her project was composting, another it was installing a rain barrel, which overfilled and tipped off its platform the first year, flooding a section of her garden - "Let's try that one again!" Natalie laughs. In the same spirit, she advises planting "too many plants - some will die, some won't work. If you plant enough, you will get

something!"

A multi-shelved rack with grow lights in the basement allows Natalie to start dozens of vegetables from seed, and she has taken up canning to make the most of her voluminous annual harvests. "I end up with 400 tomatoes and can them all," she says. She does a lot of water bath canning, a method that requires using acidic foods (tomatoes, pickles, homemade enchilada sauce), citric acid and lemon juice if you don't want botulism to enter the chat.

"Gardening means a lot of things to me," says Natalie, who works as a special education teacher. "It's all of my tranquility. I come home from a hard day at work and spend time in the yard and I feel better. It brings me a lot of joy." Having summers off allows Natalie to immerse herself in the garden in those months. "I tell my husband, 'I'll just be out there an hour!' And four hours later..."

It's dusk as we wrap up our garden tour, crossing the lawn dotted with violets and tiny bunnies. Natalie points out a rabbit's nest in front and tells me this year's project will be to build a better fence for her veggie garden.

Natalie offers a sage perspective for overwhelmed gardeners (ahem, me every May): "Just enjoy it! Being outside is a real gift and Wisconsin only has a short window. I love to take advantage. I think people in Madison are good at that."

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E. coli Source Tracking Pilot Study FAQ



What's the issue?

Every summer, beaches across the Yahara chain of lakes periodically close for swimming due to high levels of *E. coli*. This bacteria signals contamination and can pose health risks. While these closures ensure safe swimming, they also limit access to our lakes during peak summer months.

What are we doing about it?

Current beach testing protocol tells us **how much** *E. coli* but not **the source**. This summer, Clean Lakes Alliance is partnering with Public Health Madison & Dane County to identify the sources of *E. coli* that can lead to beach closures. Four beaches were selected based on their location, high incidence of runoff impacts, and high closure rates due to *E. coli*. They are:

- **Spring Harbor Beach** (Lake Mendota)
- **Olbrich Beach** (Lake Monona)
- **Esther Beach** (Lake Monona)
- **Vilas Beach** (Lake Wingra)

Why does this matter?

Pinpointing sources will help us create targeted solutions to reduce closures and improve lake health. This moves us from a place of reacting into prevention. The goals of this pilot are to reduce beach closures, enhance existing public health protections, and keep our lakes open, safe, and accessible for everyone.

How does this fit into bigger efforts to protect the beaches?

This pilot supports one of the high-priority actions identified in **RENEW THE BLUE: A Community Guide for Clean Lakes & Beaches in the Yahara Watershed**. This is a stakeholder plan for improving water quality across the Yahara watershed. Better data leads to smarter solutions that result in healthier lakes. This plan is now being implemented by 45 signatory organizations, including the Dane County Executive and City of Madison mayor.
